## **America**

**Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup> at 8:00<sup>PM</sup>**

The world discovered "America" when "A Horse with No Name" galloped onto the scene in 1972. A series of great hits indelibly linked the group to that decade. America's sound mixed rock, pop and folk to produce "I Need You," "Ventura Highway," "Don't Cross the River," "Tin Man," "Sister Golden Hair" and "Lonely People." Six of America's albums have gone gold or platinum and the group earned a Grammy for the Best New Artist in the early 70's. Gerry Beckley and Dewey Bunnell, two of the original three founders of the group still write and perform America's music. America's sound remains enduringly recognizable.



## **The Temptations - BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!**

For more than forty years, the Temptations have prospered, propelling popular music with a series of smash hits and sold-out performances throughout the world. An essential component of the original Motown machine, the Temps began their musical life in Detroit in the early sixties. It wasn't until 1964, however that Smokey Robinson wrote and produced "The Way You Do the Things You Do," which turned the guys into stars. An avalanche of hits followed - many of which like... "My Girl," "Since I Lost My Baby," "I Wish it Would Rain" and "Pappa Was a Rolling Stone" attained immortality.



## **Blues Traveler**

Rounding out the Season is New York based blues-rock quartet Blues Traveler. Led by singer and harmonica virtuoso John Popper, Blues Traveler was part of a revival of the extended jamming style of the '60s and '70s. Their first album "Blues Traveler" was released in May of 1990. It was with the release of "Four" in 1994 that Blues Traveler saw their first chart hit. "Run Around" became one of the biggest singles of 1995, spending nearly a full year on the charts and sending Four into quintuple platinum status.



## **Eureka Symphony - From Russia to Rome**

Join the Orchestra as they travel to Russia and start us out this evening with a Russian "Easter Overture" by Nicolai Rinsky-Korsakov. He is currently a member of the Gothenburg Symphony and serves on the faculty for the local Sequoia Summer Institute. After intermission we'll take a journey to Rome by way of Transylvania and enjoy "Transylvanian Dances" by Bela Bartok. "Pines of Rome" by Ottorino Respighi will be our final piece.
